WHAT'S HAPPENING AT ACACIA VILLAGE—BY LINDA RAE

Janice Maloney and Teresa Black of Sawgrass Partners recently came to Utica for two days of focus group meetings. Prior to that, they had sent out a mass marketing survey in our area with questions focused on senior living. They were thrilled to receive over 900 responses back with some respondents saying that they would happily provide more insight by attending the focus groups. Sawgrass Partners is a national research firm that works with non-profit senior service providers across the country, based out of Chicago.

While they were here, Janice and Teresa facilitated 4 focus groups and a town hall meeting with current Acacia Village residents to look at expanding independent living options at the Masonic Care Community. Participants were shown examples of Cottages which would be stand-alone homes, Garden Homes that would connect 4 homes together with a lovely courtyard in the middle and Villa style apartments with 10 to 18 apartments per building that would connect to the Acacia Village Community Center.

The participants were asked about what amenities and services are important for people to have access to; swimming pool, water aerobics, yoga, fitness classes and equipment, massage therapy services, multiple dining venues, bar and lounge.

They also surveyed participants about the importance of having a garage, porch or patio. Would they be willing to pay more for those items? Janice and Teresa also tried to get a feel for whether or not these potential new res-

idents would like to have housekeeping on a regular basis and if so, what that housekeeping should entail.

Janice and Teresa continued to inquire about interior aspects of the Cottages, Garden Homes and Villas by asking about the importance of an open floor plan, solid surface countertop, a kitchen island, dishwasher, built in microwave and more. They also asked people for their preferences when it came to different styles of refrigerators. If there were two bathrooms, should one of those bathrooms have a tub? What appeals to you more, carpet or solid surface floors? Each focus group lasted approximately 90 minutes and was filled with much discussion. At the end of each session everyone received a paper survey to fill out with the questions that had been asked throughout, so everyone had a chance to make their opinions known.

Sawgrass Partners will be getting back to us soon with the results of their research and then will work with our Masonic Board of Trustees and an architectural firm to plan the first phase of an expansion of Acacia Village. The 1st phase might include the building of 8 cottages with attached garages to be built facing the lovely pond in the backyard of Acacia Village and some remodeling of the Acacia Village Community Center.

We are looking forward to playing a small part in this exciting year and eventually meeting the students and Ms. Graulich.
